

RULES OF CONDUCT BROADVIEW PUBLIC LIBRARY DISTRICT

The first floor of the library has been designated a **QUIET STUDY AREA**. These rules have developed to promote a safe and quiet study environment for all library users.

NO PERSON SHALL:

1. Eat, drink, smoke, spit or chew gum;
2. Willfully annoy another person;
3. Damage or deface public property;
4. Improperly remove library material or equipment.
5. Loiter in the library, lobby or front of the building;
6. Enter or remain in the library without wearing shoes and shirt;
7. Makes solicitations for any reason;
8. Engage in loud or boisterous conduct;
9. Be in a state of noticeable intoxication;
10. Utter profane, obscene, or injurious language directed at another person;
11. Remain in the building after regular closing hours;
12. Bring bikes, mopeds, skateboards and/or other vehicles into the library or lobby;
13. Move library furniture from its original placement;
14. Use the library's electrical outlets for personal use for lap tops or other electronic equipment;
15. Play games, radios, walkman or cassette players; use cellular/portable telephones; or beepers;
16. Bring animals into the library or lobby except for guide dogs for visually impaired;
17. Block the entrance or exit with their person, bikes, mopeds, skateboards and/or other vehicles.
18. The library also reserves the right to limit access to equipment, facilities and material.
 - A. Only one person at a time will be allowed to use the restroom facilities
 - B. There will be no more than two persons allowed at a computer at any one time.
 - C. Elevator use is restricted to persons attending meetings or programs.
19. The seating in the adult magazine areas are for adult use only, children 14 years and over may sit in these areas if they are accompanied by an adult or can provide proper identification. Children less than 14 years of age are restricted to seating in the children area.
20. We reserve the right to inspect all bags and briefcases.

These library rules are posted for the comfort and protection of all who use the library.
